Biography/Administrative History

Virginia "Virgie" Jones (1917-2010), a writer who lived in Alamo, wrote a column "I Cover Alamo" and wrote several books, *Remembering Alamo...and Other Things Along the Way*, *Be it Ever so Humble*, and *Historical Persons and Places...in San Ramon Valley*. She wrote personal stories and interesting antidotes about residents and visitors to Alamo including history of the area. She wrote for local newspapers (*Walnut Kernel*, *Valley Pioneer*). She was also a member of the San Ramon Valley Republican Women, the Alamo Women's Club, San Ramon Valley Historical Society, the California Writer's Club, Mount Diablo branch, and a trustee for the Alamo-Lafayette Cemetery District. Her husband, Al Jones's family was among the original settlers of Alamo.
