The collection includes materials from the First Amendment Coalition (FAC), which tried to eliminate the provisions that protected homosexuals from discrimination, and materials from Citizens for Fairness for Lesbians and Gays (CFLAG), which fought to uphold them. There are also news clippings; essays and letters to the editor in favor of the ordinance from Jeffrey Ruda, a UC-Davis Art History Professor; and LGBT ephemera from UC-Davis and Sacramento.
