Scope and Content of Collection

Correspondence of Iŭliia Ginzburg, a specialist in study of literature, translator from French, Italian, and English, and public figure. Ginzburg was very active in public life of the 1990s as a head of the executive committee of the Grazhdanin (Citizen) social and political movement and a chief editor of a newspaper of the same title. The letters sent to her friends to the US reflect life in the Soviet Union and in Russia during stagnation and perestroika.
