The collection contains correspondence relating to his editorial duties at two of these periodicals, as well as his writings on Soviet education and English and Russian-language study guides. There is also a work by his wife, Polina V. Swatikoff, on Joseph de Maistre in Russia (SUBJECT FILE).
