Abstract: The collection consists of materials related to the career of UCLA professor of Political Science, US policy advisor, and China scholar Richard Baum. Baum was founder of the listserv Chinapol and was an influential authority on contemporary Chinese politics who authored more than 50 scholarly studies and six books. The materials include correspondence, conference files, Baum's writings, course materials, and recordings of Baum's lectures.

Biography/History

Richard Baum was born in Los Angeles, CA on July 8, 1940. Baum Studied political science at UCLA, receiving his bachelor's degree in 1962. Baum continued his political science studies at UC Berkeley, receiving his master's degree in 1963 and his doctorate in 1970. Baum traveled to Taiwan in 1967 to study Mandarin while working towards his doctorate degree. It was during this trip that Baum discovered classified materials documenting activities at the highest levels of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). Baum launched into his scholarly career when he made unauthorized copies of these documents and used the materials to write an analysis of the conflicts between Chairman Mao's Cultural Revolution and the interests of the CCP.

Baum began teaching Political Science at UCLA in 1968 and continued his career there for 44 years. While at UCLA, Baum was also the director of the Center for Chinese Studies from 1999 until 2005. Throughout his career, Baum was an influential authority on contemporary Chinese politics, serving as a popular media commentator and a high-level U.S. policy advisor. Baum served on the editorial boards for numerous scholarly journals, including the US-China Institute and China Quarterly. Baum was the founder of Chinapol, an extensive listserv used by scholars, officials, and journalist to discuss Chinese politics. Additionally, Baum authored more than 50 scholarly studies and six books, including *Burying Mao: Chinese*

Politics in the Age of Deng Xiaoping. Baum died in Los Angeles, California on December 14, 2012.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of materials related to the career of professor, advisor, and China scholar Richard Baum. The materials include correspondence, conference files, Baum's writings, course materials, and recordings of Baum's lectures. The collection relates to Baum's teaching and directing roles at UCLA, high-level U.S. policy advising, trips to China, speaking engagements, and conference presentations. Many notes in this collection include the intricate mandala doodles of Baum.
